Birthdays

Reading

Please continue to practice letter naming (upper and lower case) with your child. Research shows that children who can identify all letters automatically tend to be more successful readers. Also, knowing the sight words (so far, I, am, the, and little) when they see them, will help in reading successfully.

Try to read daily to your child and have your child read the little books they bring home to you. Parents have told me that the booklets fit nicely in a shoe box. Perhaps your child could decorate the box and "show off" by reading for family members and guests at your home.

Next week we will begin working on letter sounds to help children sound out unfamiliar words.

Dismissal

If you are picking up your child from school, please come forward to greet your child. The kindergarten teachers take turns dismissing the children and we can not be sure which adult is waving to which child. We want to be sure every child stays safe.
