For this week we are going to continue to review for the AP World test. Your folder should already be organized to match the setup below (follow the [video](#) if you're confused on the setup). Remember, the "AP Exam Review" folder should be shared with me so I can check on your progress:

This week, I am going to post seven files on Google Classroom. Add those files to the folder "Networks of Exchange," and complete them by the end of the week. This should take you about an hour. After that task is complete, you will be prepared to write a DBQ for unit one. There will be a new rubric posted on the top and bottom of the DBQ for you to review.. Remember, you can use outside materials when writing the DBQ and also be sure to time yourself on the DBQ. Respond directly on the file. You will have 45 minutes to complete it on the day of the AP test. Hold yourself to it by setting a timer or have someone in your household keep time. There will be fewer review sheets going forward since the information will be more familiar and increase the focus on skills gauged by the results of this week's DBQ.
